About our Keynote Speaker



Dr. John Keung Chairman, BCA Centre of Sustainable Buildings

Dubbed the architect of the green building movement in Singapore, Dr John Keung is the first Southeast Asian to be conferred the Chairman's Award by the World Green Building Council in 2015. He was also named one of the Top 25 Newsmakers of the Year 2013 by Engineering News-Record (ENR), USA and received the prestigious Green Visionary Award from the Singapore Green Building Council in 2017 for pioneering the green building movement in Singapore. He was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Gold) by the Singapore Government in 2011 for his contributions to public administration.

Currently, Dr Keung is the Chairman of the BCA Centre of Sustainable Buildings, a centre established in collaboration with the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). He also helms the BCA Academy as its Dean. Prior to his current appointments, he served as the Chief Executive Officer of Singapore's Building and Construction Authority (BCA) for 11 years till 2017. Under his leadership, BCA moved Singapore into the position of a global leader in green buildings in the tropics, raised construction productivity drastically by a cumulative 12% from 2010 to 2017 and transformed its built environment sector into one that is sustainable, digitally and technologically advanced through the adoption of Design for Manufacturing and Assembly (DfMA) and Integrated Digital Delivery (IDD). Dr Keung also transformed the former Construction Industry Training Institute (CITI) which focused on training of workers into the current BCA Academy that focusses on the training of the professional, managerial, executive and technical (PMET) workforce.

Dr Keung was the Deputy CEO (Building) and Acting Chief Executive Officer the Housing and Development Board (HDB) from 2001 to 2006, overseeing new town planning, design, construction and management, the various upgrading programmes for the existing public housing estates, related infrastructure and reclamation works as well as contract and project management.

Prior to joining HDB, he was the Deputy CEO and Deputy Chief Planner of the Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA), responsible for the formulation of the 1991 and 2001 Singapore Concept Plans, the successive Master Plans, strategic planning and development control matters as well as the implementation of the world's first Electronic Development Application (EDA) system, enabling electronic submission for planning approval anywhere, anytime.

Dr Keung held senior management positions in other public agencies such as the Ministry of National Development (MND) and the Planning Department. He also served as the co-Executive Director of the Clean Energy Programme Office (CEPO), Economic Development Board (EDB) and as chairman and board members of a number of agencies and institutes such as the Solar Energy Research Institute Singapore (SERIS) and the BCA International.

Dr Keung holds Adjunct Professorships in the National University of Singapore (NUS), the Nanyang Technological University (NTU) and the Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS). He is currently the Chairman of the Built Environment Cluster Advisory Committee, SUSS, a member of the College Advisory Board, College of Engineering, NTU and a member of the Architecture and Sustainable Design Advisory Committee, Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD). He also serves as a Senior Fellow of the URA Academy, an Adjunct Senior Fellow of the SUTD Academy and a Fellow of the Centre for Livable Cities. He is a frequent keynote speaker on many built environment, housing and urban planning topics in local and international conferences, besides green building and construction productivity.

Dr Keung is a Chartered Town Planner, Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI), UK and a Fellow of the Singapore Institute of Planners (SIP). He earned his PhD in Town Planning from the University of Wales, UK and completed the Advanced Management Programmes (AMPs) in both INSEAD, Fontainebleau, France and Stanford University, California, USA.


